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GrievancePolicy

The institute has well defined Grievance Redressal Policy to address any kind of grievance. Various committees like Women Grievance / Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee, Anti-Ragging Committee, Caste Based Discrimination Prevention Committee are formed under anumbrella of Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) for taking appropriate action against anygrievance.

GrievanceRedressalMechanism(GRM)

Grievance Redressal is a management- and governance-related process adopted in Institute. The term "Grievance Redressal" primarily covers the receipt and processing of complaintsfrom stakeholders, a wider definition includes actions taken on any issue raised by them tofunction as per their roles more effectively. The institute has a Grievance RedressalCommittee, which takes careof anykind of Grievanceoccurringin theorganization. The effectiveness of implementation of a Grievance Redressal Mechanism (GRM) can becalculated with thefollowing parameters:

Process

- Input acceptance: Faculty members/ staff members and students may convey
 theirgrievance to the organization through online mechanism available on ERP.
 Theymay also submit their grievances through feedback forms, emails or in person
 to the Grievance Redressal Committee.
- Anonymity: Complainants are often reluctant to report grievances that targetindividual faculty or staff members of the organization. To avoid such issues thecommittee assures that Complainant identity will be hidden from others, and preferably from everyone.

WorkFlow

The objective of this cell is to deal with redress of grievance. The aggrieved individuals(Faculty/staff/students) shall indicate the details of his/her grievance and the same to theprincipal, who in turn will refer the same to the concern redressal committee. The grievance of the individual will be given fair and reasonable opportunity to be heard in detail before the chairman and other members of the concerned committee in a peaceful and conciliatory environment depending upon the issue if need to be, appropriate evidence in the form of amaterial evidence or personal witness may be introduced by the aggrieved person. The chairman of the committee, in constitution with the member(s) will submit the report to the Director at the earliest possible time. The Director in turn, depending upon nature, magnitude and jurisdiction of the issue, will arrange for the appropriate and early measure of redressal of grievance, under the management and same will be communicate to the 'aggrieved person'.

Alltheproceeding, of the Grievance Mechanism will be suitably documented and recorded

Terms of Reference of the Grievance Redress al Committee

- Any employee of the college could address his/her grievance in writing to theChairmanofthe Committee.
- Thegrievancecould bearisingout of policymatters orpersonal reasons.
- Whenever an employee wishes to put forth any claim or seeks redress of
 anygrievance or of any wrong, which he deemed having been done to him, he
 mustforward his case through proper channel, and shall not forward such advance
 copiesof his application to any higher authority, unless the lower authority has
 rejected theclaim, or refused relief, or the disposal of the matter is delayed by more
 than threemonths.
- No employee shall be a signatory to any joint representation addressed to theauthorities for redress of any grievance or for any other matter.
- The committee shall call for meeting within a week of receiving any grievance and submit its recommendations to the Director within a fortnight of having received agrievance. The process could be expedited at the discretion of the Chairman of committee if the grievance be of such an ature which may need immediate attention.
- Three members of the committee, present in person, shall constitute a quorum at anymeeting of the committee.
- If the complaint is against any member of the committee at above, he /she shall notform the quorum of that committee in which his / her case is being heard of anddecided. In such a case, the senior most person on the committee will co-opt anothersuitable member with the permission of Director to have the quorum of threememberson thecommittee.
- ThedecisionoftheDirectorwill befinal.



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Women's Grievance/Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell

The Institution has established Women's Grievance Cell with the objectives of redressing thegrievances of the students and the staff, of any sort related to women. It provides confidentialand supportive environment for members of the campus community who might likely havebeen sexually harassed; advises complainant of the informal and formal means of redressal; ensures the fair and timely redressal of sexual harassment complaints. It also provides information regarding counseling and support services on the campus, and promotesawareness about sexual harassment through educational initiatives that encourages andfostersarespectfuland safecampus environment.

Objectives of the Cell

- Toprovide aplatform for listeningto complaints and redressal of grievances.
- To incorporate hygiene habits and ensure a healthy atmosphere in and around theuniversity premises.
- To prevent sexual harassment and to promote general well-being of female students, teaching and non-teaching women staff of the institute.

- To advice complainants of the informal and formal means of resolution as specifiedbythe Cell;
- Toensurethe fair and timely resolution of sexual harassment complaints;
- Toprovideinformationregardingcounsellingandsupport servicesonthe campus;
- To ensure that students, faculty and staff are provided withcurrent and comprehensive materials on sexual harassment and assault;
- To promote awareness about sexual harassment through educational initiatives thatencouragesandfosters a respectfuland safecampus environment.

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Goalsof the Cell

TheCellseekstoachieve

- Awareness Through Dissemination of Information through production, distributionandcirculation of printedmaterials, posters andhandouts
- Awareness Through Workshops about sexual harassment for faculty, non-teachingstaff and students. The aim is to develop non-threatening and non-intimidatingatmosphereof mutual learning.
- Awareness by Counseling Confidential counseling service is an important serviceas it provides a safe space to speak about the incident and how it has affected thevictim because sexual harassment cases are rarely reported as it is being a sensitiveissue.

Preventivesteps

It will be the endeavorofthe committee:-

- Tofacilitateasafeenvironmentthat isfreeofsexualharassment.
- To promote behaviors that create an atmosphere that ensures gender equality andequalopportunities.

Remedial

- To ensure that the mechanism for registering complaints is safe, accessible andsensitive.
- Themechanismforregisteringcomplaintsissafe, accessibleandsensitive.
- To take cognizance of complaints about sexual harassment, conduct enquiries, provide assistance and redressal to the victims, recommend penalties and take actionagainst the harasser, if necessary.
- To advice the competent authority to issue warnings or take the help of the law tostoptheharasser, ifthe complainant consents.
- Toseekmedical, policeandlegalintervention with the consent of the complainant.
- To make arrangements for appropriate psychological, emotional and physical support (in the form of counseling, security and other assistance) to the victim if sodesires.



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Procedure for Registering Complaints

- All complaints must be brought by the complainant in person to any member of thecommittee. The exception for this will be in case of forced confinement of theperson. In such a case, brought by another person on behalf of the complainant, thecommittee will examine whether an investigation, intervention or some otherassistance needed. In exceptional cases, third party/witness complaints may beentertained. In such cases, the committee will ascertain whether the person alleged tohave been harassed wishes to lodge a formal complaint. Once such a complaint isreceivedthe committeeshall proceed to investigate it as per the procedure specified.
- If the complainant wishes, can be accompanied by a representative. The committeewill consist of three faculty members to be nominated by the academic andManagementcouncil foraperiod ofthreeyears.
- A complainant can go directly to the competent authority. However, in such
 cases, which should be exceptional, the complainant should give reasons for doing
 so. Insuch cases, it is open to the competent authority to refer the complaint back
 to theappropriate committee/authority.

EnquiryProcedure

Asuggested enquiryprocedure would beasfollows:-

- Any person may register a complaint of Sexual Harassment against any student, employee or third party of the Institute or vice versa, with the Chairperson or, at their choice, any of the other members of the committee. They should do so at the earliest point of time, but preferably within 30 days of occurrence of the alleged incident.
- The complaint may be made orally or in writing. If the complaint is made orally, the complainant will be requested to confirm the complaint inwriting and signit.
- The committee, or a minimum of 3 members of the full Committee, will meet withthe complainant latest within 30 days of receipt of the complaint. They will informthecomplainant of this meeting date at the earliest.
- At the first meeting with the Committee, the Complaint will be heard and his/herstatements will be recorded. The complainant will be asked to produce anycorroborativematerial that can substantiatethecomplaint.
- The committee will record the proceedings of the enquiry, and the attendance of all parties present at anyof themsetings.
- Thereafter, the person accused of the alleged Sexual Harassment will be called for ameeting with the Committee. The letter of invitation will mention the fact that acomplaint has been registered against him/her. During the meeting the complaint willbe related to the Accused in detail, and the Accused will be given the opportunity toprovidehis/her view ofthesituation.

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- The Committee will provide the Accused with a copy of the statement of allegationmade by the Complainant, and provide the Accused with an opportunity to submit awrittenresponse, should he/sheso desire, within 15 days of receipt of the statement.
- The Complainant will be provided with a copy of the written response submitted bytheAccused.
- If the Complainant or the Accused want to call on witnesses, they must write to the Committee with the names and contact details of those witnesses, after which the Chairperson of the Committee will call the witnesses.
- If the Complainant wishes to provide any documentary evidence, he/she must supplytrue copies of those documents to the Chairperson of the Committee.
 Similarly, if theAccused wishes to tender any documentary evidence, he/she will be requested toprovide true copies of those documents to the Complainants Committee.
 To ensurethat the documents are considered as true copies, parties will be required to sign thedocuments submitted.
- After having heard both parties, the Committee will conduct an enquiry into theevidence provided by both parties. The enquiry may include meeting with witnesses, consultation with experts and any other activities required to establish a balancedviewofthecase.
- The committee will provide every reasonable opportunity to the Complainant and totheAccusedto put forward,and defend their respective cases.
- The Committee will complete the enquiry as soon as is reasonably possible, and communicate its findings and its recommendations for the disciplinary action, if any, to the Competent Authority.
- In case the complaint registered by the Complainant is found to be frivolous or false,theComplainant will be liableforpunishment.

Redressal

The complaints may be addressed as follows:-

- The committee can ask the Institute to suspend the alleged harasser from anadministrativepost/classesifhis/herpresenceislikelytointerfacewiththe enquiry.
- The victim of sexual harassment as per the Supreme Court judgment will have theoptiontoseektransfer of theperpetratoror theirowntransferwhereapplicable.
- The Head of the Institution upon receipt of the enquiry report shall refer the same tothe Governing Body / Executive Council and Institute disciplinary action on thebasis of the recommendations of the Complaint Committee under relevant servicerules.

DIRECT

ProtectionagainstVictimization

ESHAN has an obligation to ensure that a person who registers a complaint in good faith andwithout malice is protected, and will not allow a person raising a concern to be victimized fordoing so. In the unfortunate event where, despite the best of precautions, the Complainantwould be victimized, ESHAN shall treat this as a serious matter and take disciplinary actionagainstthe perpetrator



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Anti-RaggingCommittee

Anti-ragging committee will be the supervisory and advisory committee on matters ofplanning action for building and preserving a culture of ragging free environment in theinstitute campus. Anti-ragging committee does checks regularly places like hostels, buses, canteens, classrooms and other places of student congregation, for any incidences of ragging, and shall educate the students at large in the college about menace of ragging and related punishment provisions. Anti-ragging committee will be involved in designing strategies and action plan for curbing them enace of ragging in the institute by adopting array of activities.
