This was performed for social welfare.

We often come across many such people who have been surviving in such poverty-stricken conditions that the more we reach out to these people, the more we come across the similar types. Many ragpickers, man-hole cleaners, workers and many other types of people, who are now old and ill, are now living in such sad conditions. NGOs constantly look out for help in any possible way from the volunteers and sponsors who will help us in making their lives a bit better. While sometimes our busy schedules may keep us from helping the needy, Eshan students have been trained to aid them in the best possible manner. While cash donations are the mainstay, in-kind donations of goods also play a helpful part.

The woollen caps aided poor in chilled winter conditions and helped them prevent illness. Our 34 students gave them good quality caps so that they can protect themselves from cold. They were extremely elated and excited to see fresh fruits which are often out of their reach of consumption. Fruits were specifically chosen as they play an important role in child development and provide energy thus protecting them from malnutrition. There are many institutions being run like orphanages, old-age homes, children's homes, shelters, schools.
